Switching to a new diet












Consider feeding smaller meals more frequently to optimise digestion.

In need of additional gut support?


During antibiotic treatment, diet changes or stressful events, your dog might need extra support to restore their digestive balance.

Eating unusual items?


In an attempt to soothe their tummies, dogs may eat hazardous plants or objects, potentially worsening their condition.
